

UPDATE: FAQs relating to Wales – 03/07/20

Can people living in Wales travel as far as they like to go fishing within Wales from July 6th onwards?

Yes, anglers based in Wales will be able to travel without restriction from July 6th.

Can people based in Wales now travel to England to fish?

Yes, people in Wales will be able to travel to England to fish from July 6th.

Can people based in England now travel to Wales to fish for the day?

People in England can travel to Wales to fish from July 6th. There will be no travel restrictions.

Can people based in England come to Wales for a fishing holiday?

Yes, this will be possible from the July 13th.

It is looking likely this may be moved forward to 11th July, if virus infection rates continue to drop in Wales.

Is night fishing allowed in Wales?

Night fishing is allowed in Wales – as long as it isn't a form of 'accommodation'.

For example staying in a bivvy with your rods out would be OK, as would sea fishing or sea-trout fishing through the night. If you stopped fishing and then stayed overnight at the location, that would not be allowed.

Is charter boat fishing allowed in Wales?

If permitted to operate by the local port/harbour authority, charter boat fishing is allowed in Wales subject to Welsh Government COVID-19 regulations. Social distancing rules must apply and the number of households that can meet outdoors is a maximum of two. More information [here](#).
